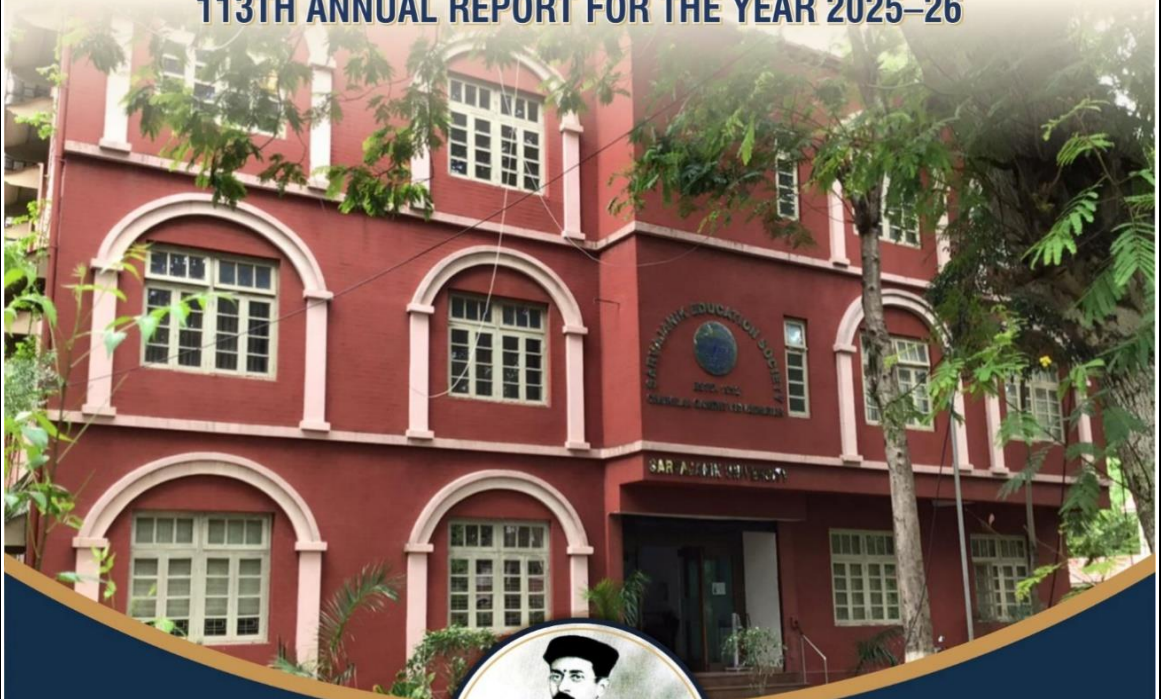

HON. PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENTS AND RESPECTED MEMBERS,

On behalf of the Managing Committee of your Society, I have great pleasure in placing before you the **113th Annual Report of Sarvajanik Education Society for the year 2025-2026**.

The year under review has been one of continued growth, expansion and consolidation for the Society. While we remained committed to strengthening our existing educational institutions and infrastructure, we also initiated several important projects to meet the growing needs of our students and institutions.

Our focus continues to be on providing **quality education at an affordable cost**, creating modern learning environments, encouraging innovation and research, promoting sports and extracurricular activities, and ensuring that the long-standing values and educational legacy of the Society remain strong.

1. INTRODUCTORY

The Auditors Report of the Society for the year ended **31st March 2026** have been uploaded on the Society's portal, and copies have been supplied to the members as requested.

During the year under report, 08 new Life Members were enrolled.

- **Election**

The proposed election for the year 2026 was fortunately averted, thanks to the spirit of fellowship, mutual respect and institutional commitment demonstrated by all the candidates.

When an appeal was made that, in the larger interest of the institution, it would be desirable to avoid an election within an educational institution, the candidates responded with maturity and magnanimity. They graciously accepted the appeal and voluntarily withdrew their candidatures. Such a gesture deserves our sincere appreciation and gratitude. Their decision reflects a deep sense of responsibility towards the institution and its larger interests, placing harmony and the dignity of the educational institution above individual aspirations.

I sincerely thank all the candidates for setting such a commendable example of unity, goodwill and institutional spirit. Their gesture will be remembered as a fine demonstration of the values that strengthen an institution and enable it to move forward together.

The Managing Committee places on record its sincere appreciation to all members and volunteers for their continued support, guidance and association with the Society.

3. INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

Infrastructure development continued to be one of the major areas of focus during the year. With the expansion of Sarvajani University and its constituent institutions, the Society has undertaken several significant projects to provide modern, spacious and purpose-built facilities.

(i) MITRAJ Sarvajani Institute of Design, Planning and Technology (MS-IDPT)

To create state of the art facilities for our programmes in Architecture, Design and Fine Arts, the Society undertook construction of a new campus with a total built-up area of 2,18,221 square feet.

We are pleased to report that during the year **2,02,360 square feet** of new facilities were completed and made available for use and interior work is currently in progress. The remaining work is expected to be completed soon.

This major development will significantly expand our academic infrastructure and create inspiring spaces for learning, innovation, creativity and collaboration. As on **31st July 2026**, the Society has spent approximately **₹36.25 crores** on this prestigious project.

The institute has been named **MITRAJ Sarvajanik Institute of Design, Planning and Technology (MS-IDPT)** in recognition of the generous donation of ₹10 crores by **Shri Rajenbhai P. Shah and Smt. Mitaben R. Shah.**

The Society gratefully acknowledges the philanthropy and generous donations of ₹5 crores by **Colourtex Industries Pvt. Ltd.** and ₹1.21 crores by **Kikani Sisters (Prof. Geetaben Kikani, Prof. Bhartiben Kikani, Dr. Minaxiben Kikani)** towards this important project.

(ii) University Administrative Building

Since the establishment of **Sarvajanik University**, the need for a dedicated administrative building has been increasingly felt. To meet this requirement, the Society has resolved to construct an extension to the existing Chunilal Gandhi Vidhyabhavan, having an area of **13,240 square feet.**

The estimated cost of the project is approximately ₹2 crores. Construction is planned to commence after the monsoon and is expected to be completed within 24 to 30 months.

The new facility will provide much-needed dedicated space for the growing administrative requirements of the University and will further strengthen its institutional infrastructure.

(iii) New College Building

We wish to create more facilities of classrooms and allied facilities for V. T. Choksi Sarvajanik Law College, B. R. C. M. College of Business Administration and Sir K. P. College of Commerce.

To address this requirement and provide adequate facilities for future expansion, the Society has resolved to construct a new college building at the K. P. College campus. The building will accommodate KP Human Sarvajanik College of Commerce and Computer Applications and B.R.C.M. College of Business Administration, thereby providing modern classrooms and allied academic facilities.

The Society expresses its sincere gratitude to **KP Human Development Foundation** for its generous contribution of ₹2 crores towards the project and for its further commitment of ₹1.51 crores. As per the terms of the donation, Sarvajanik College of Commerce and Computer Application has been named KP Human Sarvajanik College of Commerce and Computer Applications. Construction is planned to commence after the monsoon.

(iv) Sports Complex

The Society has always recognised the importance of sports and physical education in the holistic development of students. With a view to creating better sporting facilities, particularly for aquatic sports, the Society has planned a new Sports Complex at the site of the existing Boys' and Girls' Pavilion near the M. T. B. College cricket ground.

As the **first phase** of the project, a swimming pool will be constructed primarily with the objective of providing students with basic swimming skills and encouraging participation in aquatic sports. A cafeteria with other amenities is also proposed as part of the development. The approximate cost of the first phase of the project is **₹1.50 crores**.

We are grateful to **Shri Rajenbhai P. Shah** for his generous commitment to contribute **₹50 lakhs** towards this project. Construction is planned to commence after the monsoon.

(v) Redevelopment of Sheth Rangildas Khandwala Girls' Hostel

Some of the Society's older buildings have become structurally inadequate and require redevelopment in accordance with present and future requirements with better facilities.

The two buildings of the Sheth Rangildas Khandwala Girls' Hostel are among such buildings. As both buildings had become beyond economical repair, they have now been vacated, and all the girls have been accommodated in the Society's new hostel, which provides substantially improved facilities and amenities. This will also make available valuable open space at Umra for future development. The Society gratefully acknowledges the consent and continued support of the Rangildas Khandwala family for the proposed development.

(vi) Requirement of Additional Land

The growth and expansion of the University and the Society's educational institutions have created an increasing need for additional land. The Society now urgently requires a suitable additional parcel of land to sustain its future growth and to develop the educational infrastructure required for the coming decades. In keeping with the Society's long-standing motto and commitment to providing **quality education at an affordable cost**, acquisition of land at a concessional rate from the Government or through philanthropic donation would be of immense value. The Society therefore looks forward to the support of the Government, philanthropists, donors and well-wishers in this important endeavour.

4. ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

We are pleased to report that the Society has made satisfactory progress during the year under review. Although depleting students' strength in Schools especially in Gujarati medium is worrisome.

- Chandulal C. Shah Sarvajanic English High School (**C. C. Shah School**) was honoured with the **best school award** of Surat district by the education department and received ₹1,00,000/- cash prize.
- The Southern Gujarat Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SGCCI) held its annual award ceremony on 12th April 2026, during which the **SGCCI - Golden Jubilee Memorial Trust** honored Sarvajanic College of Engineering and Technology (**SCET**), a constituent college of Sarvajanic University, with the prestigious "**Mahavir Synthesis Award for Outstanding Institute/College of Education 2024-25**". These prestigious recognitions are a proud testament to the dedication, commitment and sustained efforts of our teachers, staff and students.
- From this year onwards, Sarvajanic University has established 23rd January as the date for its Convocation - a day of profound significance for all of us, observed as Shah Day in fond remembrance of our visionary founder of Sarvajanic Education Society, Shri Chunilal G. Shah. His ideals, vision and foresight continue to guide and inspire our institution.

The University held its **4th Convocation on 23rd January 2026**. The Convocation was graced by Prof. Rakesh Mohan Joshi, Hon. Vice Chancellor, The Indian Institute of Foreign Trade as the Chief Guest and Former Justice of the Gujarat High Court, Shri Ravi R. Tripathi, as the Guest of Honour.

On this memorable occasion, 2,114 students were awarded their degrees, while 52 outstanding students were felicitated with Gold Medals in recognition of their academic excellence and achievements.

The growth of the University over these past few years has been both remarkable and inspiring. At the time of its establishment, the University recorded 2,465 first-year admissions across 48 academic programmes. In just four years, through purposeful growth, perseverance and the collective efforts of our faculty and staff, the University has expanded to 53 academic programmes, welcoming 3,453 new students for the academic year 2025-26. Today, we proudly have a thriving academic family of 9,000+ students enrolled under Sarvajanic University.

This remarkable growth is not merely reflected in numbers; it is a testament to the trust placed in SES by students and parents, the dedication of our faculty and staff, and our

commitment to providing quality and value-based education. It is also a tribute to the vision of our founders, whose ideals continue to shape the University's journey towards excellence.

5. MANAGEMENT CHALLENGES

While the Society has made significant progress during the year, it continues to face certain challenges which require sustained attention and appropriate intervention.

(A) Legal Case with reference to Sunflower School of KRIBHCO

Following the termination of the management agreement with KRIBHCO in respect of Sunflower School, several cases have been filed before the Hon. Courts. The Management is strongly defending the interests of the Society and at the same time, is making sincere efforts to resolve the matter through a series of meetings and discussions with the KRIBHCO management, particularly keeping in view the interests of the employees of **KRIBHCO's Sunflower School**. As the matter is sub judice, the extent of any contingent liability cannot presently be ascertained. Based on the legal advice received, the Society believes that it has a strong case and is taking all necessary steps to protect its interests.

(B) Non-Appointment of Staff in Grant-in-Aid Schools and Colleges

The Society has been receiving grants for its educational institutions since its inception, dating back to the **Pre-Independence era**. However, during the last **15 years**, grant-in-aid institutions across the State have been facing serious difficulties, particularly with regard to the appointment of regular teaching and non-teaching staff.

A large number of sanctioned posts of teaching and non-teaching staff remain vacant for prolonged periods. In our schools, for example, there have been no fresh appointments of non teaching staff since 2009. Vacancies arising due to retirement, transfer and other reasons often

take a very long time to be filled by the Education Department. The prolonged vacancies adversely affect both academic and administrative functioning and place an additional burden on the existing staff.

The Society, while exercising financial prudence, has been compelled to make appointments at its own cost wherever necessary so that the academic and administrative activities of its institutions are not adversely affected.

As on 31/07/2026, out of total **443** sanctioned posts **195** are vacant out of which SES has filled **160** posts. During the year under report, the Society incurred deficit of **₹1,79,68,727/-** largely on account of such vacancies. Over the last 15 years, the Society has incurred deficit of **₹13,51,16,500/-** crores on this account.

This recurring financial burden is increasingly affecting the Society's ability to manage its revenue deficit, particularly when the availability of donations for this purpose is limited and unpredictable. The Society respectfully requests the Education Department and the Government of Gujarat to take immediate and appropriate action for filling vacant sanctioned posts in grant-in-aid institutions. Such intervention would not only reduce the financial burden on educational societies but, more importantly, would serve the larger interest of students and the quality of education.

(C) Leasehold Land at Experimental School

For the renewal of the lease of the land measuring 11,951 sq. meters bearing Final Plot No. M/2 of T.P. Scheme No. 5 (Athwa-Umra) of the **R. S. M. Poonawala Experimental School** run by the Society, via Resolution No. 235/2019 dated 22/02/2019 of the Standing Committee of Surat Municipal Corporation, the resolution for the renewal of the lease of the said plot is subject to the approval/sanction of the Government as well as the prescribed conditions; a proposal has been forwarded to the Government by the Surat Municipal Corporation via a letter dated 06/05/2020, which is under consideration. This is for the information of the members.

6. SARVAJANIK UNIVERSITY - CONTINUING GROWTH, DEVELOPMENT AND SOCIAL INITIATIVE

The establishment and subsequent growth of Sarvajanik University has been one of the significant milestones in the continuing educational journey of the Society. Although the

University is relatively young, it stands firmly on the strong foundation and legacy created by the Society over more than a century.

A significant initiative during the year has been the commencement of the **Sarvajanik College of Liberal Arts**, with **major disciplines in Psychology and Economics**. This is the 9th constituent college of Sarvajanik University. Sarvajanik University has also proposed its 10th constituent college of Sarvajanik University - **Sarvajanik College of Education**, which will offer an integrated programme leading to B.A., B.Ed. The application for approval from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) is under process.

I am happy to share that, from the Financial Year 2025-2026, Sarvajanik University has adopted the N. G. Zaveri Vocational Training Centre, which provides vocational training exclusively for persons with mental and physical challenges. This initiative reflects our commitment to the ideal of an inclusive society. We have also commenced another Vocational Training Centre at the V. T. Choksi Haripura Campus, further strengthening our commitment to skill development and inclusive education.

During the year, the University continued to expand its academic programmes, student intake, infrastructure and institutional activities. The Society remains committed to supporting the University's vision of becoming a centre of excellence in higher education while preserving the core values of accessibility, affordability, academic excellence and social responsibility.

Another significant development during the year was the decision that, with effect from 1st March 2026, all teaching and non-teaching staff of the University and its constituent colleges who were on 6th pay commission would be brought under the 7th Pay Commission.

Along with this, new progressive service rules were also introduced. These measures are expected to strengthen the University's ability to attract quality faculty and staff, improve employee retention, improve performance and consequently, enhance the overall quality of academic and administrative functioning.

The University's continued expansion has also increased the demand for classrooms, laboratories, administrative facilities, libraries, sports facilities and other student-centric infrastructure. The projects undertaken during the year are therefore not merely construction activities; they are investments in the future of our students and in the larger educational ecosystem of the Society.

7. FINANCIAL DISCIPLINE AND RESOURCE MOBILISATION

The Managing Committee remains conscious of the need to maintain financial discipline while simultaneously investing in the Society's future.

The scale of infrastructure development undertaken in recent years has required substantial financial resources. The Society is deeply grateful to its donors, philanthropists, corporate organisations, members and well-wishers whose contributions have enabled us to undertake several ambitious projects.

At the same time, the Society continues to explore new avenues for resource mobilisation, institutional partnerships and philanthropic support so that the development of educational infrastructure does not compromise our fundamental commitment to providing quality education at an affordable cost.

8. STUDENT WELFARE MEASURES

Inclusive education is not merely a motto for us; it is a value that we strive to translate into meaningful action. We have taken conscious steps to provide equal opportunities to students with disabilities, including visually impaired students, by enrolling them across our institutions and creating an environment in which they can learn, participate and excel alongside their peers.

During the year under report, the Society continued its commitment to making education accessible and inclusive by extending **Scholarships/ Free studentship/ Vidhyarthi sahay Nidhi** amounting to **₹1,34,26,401/-** to deserving students from diverse backgrounds. Financial assistance was provided to students facing economic hardship, students with physical disabilities, as well as those who have demonstrated excellence in sports and academics.

This initiative reflects our enduring belief that financial/ physical circumstances should never become a barrier to education, talent or aspiration. Through these steps, we endeavour to encourage deserving students to pursue their educational goals with confidence and dignity and to realise their full potential.

9. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The Managing Committee expresses its sincere gratitude to all those who have contributed to the progress of Sarvajanic Education Society during the year.

- **Opinion**

We have conducted audit of Sarvajanik Education Society Office and for consolidation of the same with other Units, we have relied upon the work of other Auditors.

Our Opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

- **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Management either intends to

NOTES FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

(A) Significant Accounting Policies:

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation and presentation of the accounts are as under:

1) Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Society and its various institutions have been drawn up on historical cost convention and largely on accrual basis.

2) Property Plant & Equipment:

All fixed assets are stated at cost. Cost comprises of purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to working condition for its intended use. Assets purchased for specific grants are netted off against the respective capital grants received and the balance, if any, capitalized.

3) Depreciation:

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided under Written down Value method as under;

4) Investments:

Investments are stated at cost and are suitably adjusted to recognize permanent diminution in value, if any.

5) Retirement Benefits

(a) When Gratuity is provided by Society and various Institutions, based on their own estimate where no actuarial valuation is carried out:

In Terms of clause(b) of the applicable paragraph of the Accounting Standard 15- "Employee Benefits" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, substantial requirements of the said standard do not become applicable to the Society. No actuarial valuation has been undertaken by the society, however it has provided for the liability based on its own estimate, which is preferred over the requirement of Accounting Standard-15 "Employee Benefits" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

(b) Where gratuity is provided by the Society and various Institutions based on the actuarial valuation:

In terms of the Accounting Standard-15 "Employee Benefits" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, substantial requirements of the said standard do not become applicable to the Society. The Society has relied on the actuarial valuation

undertaken by the Life Insurance Corporation of India, to whom the society has vested the Funds for the management. At each Balance Sheet date, based on the Actuarial Workings, the entity contributes to the fund managed by the Life Insurance Corporation of India.

6) Income Recognition:

- Incomes from Various Activities are recognised on accrual basis.
- Donations received in cash are recognised as income when they are received.
- Donation made with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus fund or endowment fund of the trust are classified as such, and are directly reflected as Trust Fund receipts in the Balance Sheet.
- Grants received are generally accounted as income on its receipt.
- Grants received by schools / colleges and then transferred to the Society are recognised on an accrual basis when there is reasonable certainty of their receipt in future periods.
- Specific Project Grants are recognised as Income based on actual amount spent in a year on that project. Such income is booked only where there is certainty of Grant being sanctioned / approved in future and necessary entries are passed in accounts. Grants received for specific projects remaining unutilised at the year-end are shown as Grant Unutilized and on completion of Projects are returned back to donor, if the terms of grant indicate the same.
- Other Income / Interest income is recognised on accrual basis.

7) Foreign Currency transactions:

Foreign Currency transactions are recorded at the conversion rates existing on transaction date.

(B) NOTES ON ACCOUNTS:

- 1) A part of the income received from Interest on Savings Bank A/c, related to Amenity A/c of Self-Finance Institutions [SFI-B] and Grantable Colleges has been disclosed under Current Liabilities in accordance with the provisions of the by-laws of Sarvajani Education Society which restrict recognition of such income under Income & Expenditure Statement of the society.
- 2) During the year, expenses incurred by Sarvajani Education Society (Sponsoring Body) which are attributable and apportionable to the Sarvajani University are culled out from the expenses so incurred by Sarvajani Education Society. They are measured at an appropriate rate per student for the presentation of Income and Expenditure account as per the resolution passed by the Board of Management.

- c) BRCM College of Business Administration has subscribed to LIC Group Gratuity Policy No. 712001850 in 2023. LIC does not generate Group Gratuity report under AS-15 before term of two years from the subscription to such policy. Therefore, AS-15 report for the year ended 31st March, 2024 for such additional policy is not available with the BRCM College of Business Administration. As a result, for the first time, LIC has provided actuarial working of Present Value of Obligations and Fair value of Plan Assets for Policy No. 712001850 during FY 2024-25. Accordingly, there is difference in the opening balance of the present value of obligations and plan assets as on 1st April, 2025 as compared to the closing balance of such items as on 31st March, 2025. It does not have any financial implications on the Accounts of current year or previous year.
- 4) During the financial year 2025-26, various assets and liabilities lying under "Amenities" A/c which was separately maintained by various self-finance institutions has been transferred/merged into the regular accounts of respective units. Accordingly, no Amenities A/c subsist under the respective self-finance institutions as at the year end.
